Heartfelt thanks to the hundreds of Nativity families who have supported our *Centennial Campaign*. Through this amazing generosity, we can address our immediate financial needs to complete restoration of our beautiful church and eliminate debt on the school building. Campaign support also planted seeds to grow our endowments. THANK YOU!

Church Restoration

The Church reconstruction project is going very well, and the crews have made great progress together so far. Special thanks is in order for Steve Boatman's hard work and adept coordination, as well as the multiple expert contractors collaborating to restore our beautiful, historic sanctuary and worship space.

Scaffolding is now installed on the altar and is otherwise ahead of schedule, with a target of February 28 to be fully installed.

Gaytee-Palmer, our stained glass contractor, has now removed all stained glass windows that need reinforcement, and is now performing the re-leading process.

American Masonry has completed the "from the ground" stonework and is now utilizing the scaffolding to work on the windows of the altar.

Pinnacle Wall has completed repairs of the southwest stairwell and the Mary and Joseph chapels. They have now moved into the northeast stairwell and will then head into the west choir loft alcove, before eventually moving onto the scaffolding.

JB Nelson Painting has finished the southwest stairwell and will move next to the Joseph and Mary chapels, followed by the west side aisle.

Reaching our campaign fundraising goal ensures there will be no unnecessary delays in the construction process and the church will reopen full-time for Mass and other liturgical events as soon as possible.

Steiner Hall Renovation

By reaching our campaign fundraising goal, we can begin making plans to devote at least \$250,000 for the first set of updates in 40 years to Steiner Hall, our primary hospitality space.

Functional upgrades include updated bathrooms, new wall partitioning, and A/V upgrades — including the possibility of outfitting the room for livestreaming capabilities — and more to maximize its use and create a more welcoming space.

School Debt Retirement

By reaching our campaign fundraising goal, we are now able to retire the \$1 million residual debt on the school facilities, saving over \$144,000 annually. Retiring the debt strengthens our finances and frees up money for student and academic programming and faculty salaries — ensuring Nativity's school retains and attracts the best teachers possible.

Parish and School Endowments

By exceeding our campaign fundraising goal, we will now be able to increase our Parish and School Scholarship endowments at our desired projected levels of \$250,000 each. This investment will help bolster our annual budgets for forward-thinking capital and programming improvements.

Furthermore, the two endowments will be the primary recipients of funds received beyond our fundraising goal. As we continue to invite contributions from each family in our parish community, including both the church and school, reaching 100% family participation would allow for a significant increase in both endowments and bring about a powerful impact on the financial standing of the parish, now and into the future.

Endowments: Hope for the Future

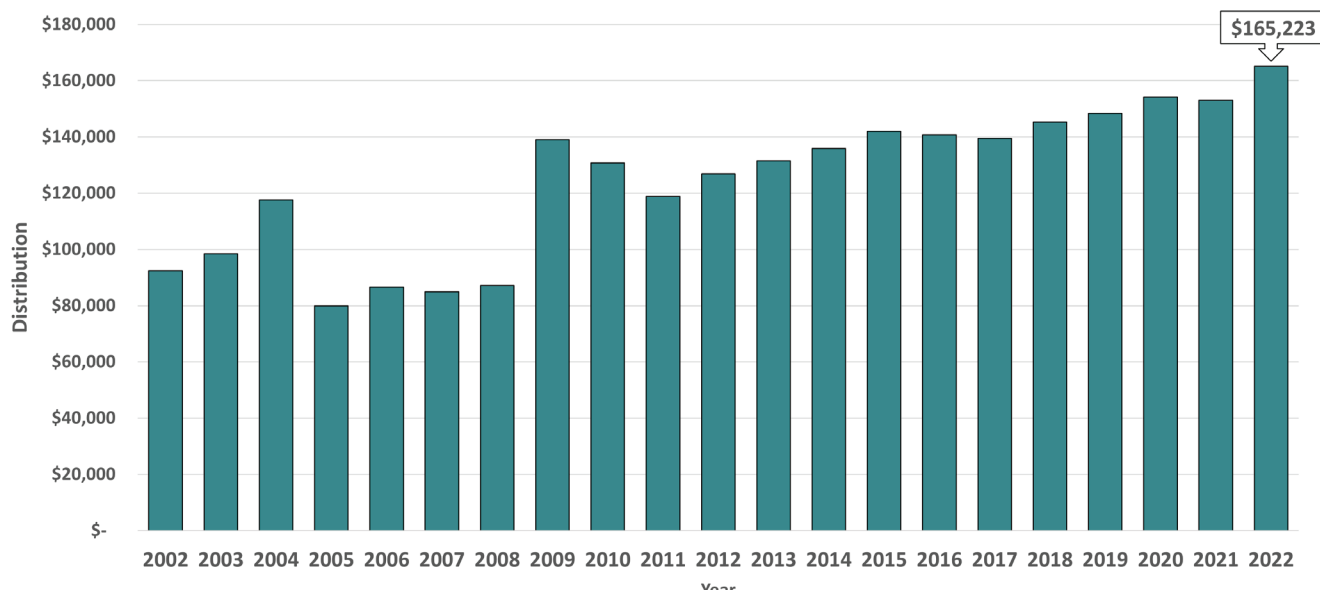
